Dear Friends of the Saylor Cement Kilns, Almost 2000 years ago the Romans built the Pantheon, an impressive architectural marvel for its time, using cement in the construction process. But then the art of making cement was lost, together with any records on how it had been manufactured. Centuries later in Pennsylvania we have a unique opportunity to preserve the history of cement making for future generations, perhaps under not so dissimilar circumstances. The Saylor Cement Kilns have been embedded in the Lehigh Valley since they were erected in 1892-93, operating until 1904. They have contributed to the manufacturing of cement that has been the foundation of many architectural and engineering achievements still standing around us: at the beginning of the 20th

century the area cement companies contributed about 75% of the nation's needs. Perhaps more importantly these kilns are a symbol to many families in the Lehigh Valley of stable and valuable jobs from the local cement industry that have been passed on from generation to generation. The objective of the Saylor Cement Kilns Preservation Society is to help preserve the nine Schoefer vertical kilns that are still standing at Saylor Park in Coplay. There are many ways you can contribute to the preservation of the kilns in addition to making a donation when signing up for a membership.
